**AUTHORIZATION FOR RECEIPT OF
SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES
ADMINISTRATION FEDERAL BLOCK GRANT FUNDS
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004
(ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS)
(4 VOTES)**

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Authorize the receipt of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Federal Block Grant (FBG) funds in the amount of \$15,927,566 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2003-2004, in accordance with the State Department of Mental Health's (SDMH) initial allocation worksheet (Attachment I). At no cost to the County, SAMHSA FBG funds are allocated through SDMH for the provision of integrated services to adults and older adults with a serious mental illness (SMI) and children with a serious emotional disturbance (SED).
2. Approve the Request for Appropriation Adjustment for \$660,000 for FY 2003-2004 (Attachment II). The appropriation increase, which is fully offset by additional SAMHSA FBG funds, will provide the Department of Mental Health (DMH) with additional spending authority to enhance mental health services to SMI and SED target populations.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

On October 7, 2003, the Director of Mental Health received an updated notification from SDMH of the FY 2003-2004 SAMHSA initial allocation (Attachment I). Board approval

is required to authorize the receipt of this SAMHSA FBG award and DMH's additional spending authority.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The recommended Board actions are consistent with the County's Programmatic Goal 7, Health and Mental Health, within the Countywide Strategic Plan. Services will be accessible and integrated into a comprehensive service delivery system through the collaboration of government agencies, private agencies, and community-based organizations.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no increase in net County cost. SAMHSA FBG funds for mental health services are disbursed to the State of California pursuant to the State Budget Act of 2003. For FY 2003-2004, the initial SAMHSA allocation for Los Angeles County is \$15,927,566.

DMH's FY 2003-2004 Adopted Budget includes \$15,268,000 for the SAMHSA FBG. With the appropriation increase of \$660,000, fully funded by the SAMHSA FBG, the total SAMHSA budgeted amount will be \$15,928,000. The appropriation increase will provide additional spending authority to enhance mental health services to SMI and SED target populations.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

SAMHSA FBG funds are used to provide integrated services to SMI adults and older adults and SED children. The State Budget Act of 2003 authorizes the allocation of SAMHSA FBG funds to counties. To receive the SAMHSA FBG allocation, the County is required to submit an annual application for renewal of FBG funds in compliance with SDMH's instructions and Federal statutes. On July 14, 2003, the Director of Mental Health received notification from SDMH of the FY 2003-2004 SAMHSA initial planning estimate and instructions for the annual submission of the SAMHSA Renewal Application. On August 28, 2003, DMH submitted the SAMHSA Renewal Application to SDMH.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES


SAMHSA FBG funds are used to maintain and/or enhance existing mental health programs, which are detailed in the SAMHSA Renewal Application submitted to SDMH. An array of treatment and supportive services include, but are not limited to, mental

health outpatient, medication, crisis intervention, day rehabilitation, case management, substance abuse counseling, emergency shelter, housing assistance, vocational rehabilitation, money management, training and education, and community outreach.


