SUBJECT: MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AGREEMENTS/AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director of Mental Health by your Board, this is notification of the execution of 17 Amendments to existing and/or new Legal Entity (LE) Agreements, Specialized Agreements, Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Agreements, Medi-Cal Professional Services Agreements (Individual and Group Providers), Clinical Assessment programs and execution of eight (8) new Agreements processed in the month of October 2010, as follows:

- 1. Amendment No. 21 (MH010054) with The Regents of the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) adds \$500,000 of MHSA Innovations funding for the Co-Occurring Disorders (COD) Training Project. The revised Total Contract Amount (TCA) will be \$3.610.652.
- 2. Agreement (MH010076) with California State University, Bakersfield is an Affiliation Agreement for Student Professional Development Programs effective October 5, 2010 through June 30, 2015.
- 3. Agreement (MH050043) with The Regents of UCLA is a Consultant Services Agreement for MHSA - Prevention & Early Intervention (PEI) effective August 9, 2010 through June 30, 2014.
- Agreement (MH060045) with East Valley Glendora Hospital, L.P., dba East 4. Valley Hospital Medical Center is a Fee-For-Service (FFS) Hospital Agreement for Medi-Cal Acute Psychiatric Inpatient Hospital Services effective October 25, 2010 through June 30, 2011.
- 5. Amendment No. 3 (MH110001) with Unilab Corporation dba Quest Diagnostics increases \$85,000 in MHSA funds. The revised Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) will be \$821,518 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2009-10.
- 6. Amendment No. 1 (MH120558) with Tri-City Mental Health Center adds a new Provider Number (PN), to be announced (TBA), and service delivery site "To Enrich Lives Through Effective And Caring Service"

located at 1900 Royalty Drive, Suites 180 and 280, Pomona, CA 91767. Services to be provided at this site include Targeted Case Management (TCM) Services, Mode 15, Service Function Codes (SFCs) 01-09; Mental Health Services (MHS), Mode 15, SFCs 10-19/30-59; Medication Support Services, Mode 15, SFCs 60-69; and Crisis Intervention Services, Mode 15, SFCs 70-79. The MCA will remain the same.

- 7. Amendment No. 5 (MH120586) with South Central Health and Rehabilitation Program (SCHARP) decreases the MHSA Wellness/Client - Run Centers Non-Medi-Cal/Indigent funds by \$17,550; increases the MHSA Wellness/Client - Run Centers Medi-Cal/Healthy Families (HF) by \$45,691. The revised MCA will be \$7,330,926.
- 8. Amendment No. 1 (MH120608) with Broadwater Community Care Center, LLC, delegates the duties and assigns the rights under this Agreement from Assignor, Broadwater Community Care Center, LLC, to Assignee, KF Community Care, LLC, to be responsible for all obligations of the Assignor, past, present, and future.
- 9. Amendment No. 4 (MH120654) with Pacific Clinics decreases MHSA Wellness/Client Run Centers Non-Medi-Cal/Indigent by \$175,000, MHSA Full Service Partnership (FSP) Adult Non-Medi-Cal/Indigent by \$435,100; increases MHS Wellness Medi-Cal/HF by \$455,610, MHSA Field Capable Clinical Services (FCCS) Medi-Cal/HF by \$1,132,777. The revised MCA will be \$74,946,379.
- 10. Amendment No. 1 (MH120671) with St. Joseph Center decreases Homeless Non-Medi-Cal/Indigent by \$70,082; increases Homeless Medi-Cal/HF by \$20,000. The revised MCA will be \$1,115,293.
- 11. Amendment No. 4 (MH150207) with Chong W. Roh dba El Camino Pharmacy changes the address site from 6356 Vineland Avenue, North Hollywood, CA 91606 to 10940 Victory Boulevard, North Hollywood, CA 91606.
- 12. Agreement (MH200113) with Santa Clarita Community College District is a MHSA Master Agreement effective October 12, 2010 through June 30, 2011.
- 13. Amendment No. 1 (MH200113) with Santa Clarita Community College District provides revised language pertaining to "Contractor's Obligations as a Business Associate Under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996 and the Health Information Technology for Economic and

Clinical Health Act (Business Associate Agreement)" to bring the Agreement into compliance with changes in HIPAA laws and regulations.

14. Amendment No. 2 (MH200113) with Santa Clarita Community College District adds new provisions to the Agreements pursuant to the new Ordinance No. 2009-0026 (Los Angeles County Code 2.206, Defaulted Property Tax Reduction Program).

The following two (2) Amendments to LE Agreements (15 and 16) increase the Specialized Foster Care Funded Program Medi-Cal/HF Maximum Program Amount for the purpose of providing Wraparound services under the Katie A. Strategic Plan:

- **15.** Amendment No. 2 (MH120591) with The Village Family Services by \$1,166,640, with revised MCAs of \$4,267,203, \$4,267,203, and \$4,267,203 for FYs 2010-11, 2011-12, and 2012-13, respectively.
- 16. Amendment No. 4 (MH120622) with D'Veal Corporation dba D'Veal Family and Youth Services by \$404,280. The revised MCA will be \$7,570,534.

The following two (2) Amendments to LE Agreements (17 and 18) add Mode 15, and various SFCs:

- 17. Amendment No. 4 (MH120570) with Hamburger Home dba Aviva Family and Children's Services dba Aviva Center adds SFC 58, Therapeutic Behavioral Services (TBS) at a provisional rate of \$2.52 to PN 7221. The MCA will remain the same.
- **18.** Amendment No. 5 (MH120654) with Pacific Clinics adds SFCs 60-69 Medication Support Services to PN 7439. The MCA will remain the same.
