SUBJECT: **AMENDMENTS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AGREEMENTS**

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director of Mental Health by your Board, this is notification of the execution of 202 Amendments to existing Legal Entity (LE) Agreements, Specialized Agreements, Medi-Cal Professional Services Agreements (Individual and Group Providers), and Clinical Assessment programs processed in the month of May, as follows:

1. **Amendment No. 8 (DMH-01750) with Value Options, Inc.**, extends the term of this Agreement for one (1) more year beginning July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009. Increases existing rate from \$43.41 to \$44.93 for administrative services provided per month per eligible beneficiary to reflect Contractor's increased costs. Annual administrative fee of \$6,500 in County General Funds (CGF) for maintenance of Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Compliant 837 Claim File. The Maximum Contract Amount (MCA) shall remain the same at \$1,506,500.
2. **Amendment No. 4 (DMH-02097) with Barbour and Floyd Medical Associates** for Fiscal Year (FY) 2005-06, increases non-Early and Periodic, Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) – CGF funds by \$118,366; increases non-EPSDT-Federal Financial Participation (FFP) funds by \$118,366. For FY 2005-06 only, the MCA will be increased by \$236,732 with a revised MCA of \$2,234,455.
3. **Amendment No. 6 (MH050013) with California Institute for Mental Health** adds Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction (MIOCR) Grant funds through an Intrafund Transfer from the Department of Probation in the amount of \$101,750 to the Total Compensation Amount (TCA) for FY 2007-08, only for the provision of mental health consultation services to the Department of Mental Health (DMH) staff and contract agencies that deliver Functional Family Therapy (FFT) services to seriously emotionally disturbed (SED) juvenile offenders. The revised TCA for FY 2007-08 will be \$2,135,408.

4. **Amendment No. 10 (MH120144) with Pacific Clinics** adds \$190,000 in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Outreach and Engagement one-time funds; for FYs 2007-08 and 2008-09, deletes Targeted Case Management Services (TCMS), Mental Health Services (MHS), and Crisis Intervention under existing Provider Number (PN) 7692 located at 238 South Rampart Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA 90057. For FY 2007-08, the MCA will be increased by \$190,000 with a revised MCA of \$78,594,445.
5. **Amendment No. 3 (MH120179) with Transitional Living Centers for L.A. County, Inc.**, adds MHSA Wellness Center – non-Client Run funds in the amount of \$336,440. For FY 2007-08, MHSA funds totaling \$93,000 can be used to cover MHSA allowable Wellness Centers – non-Client Run one-time costs. For FY 2007-08, increases Local Mental Health Plan (MHP) non-Medi-Cal Plan funds – CGF in the amount of \$221,860. For FY 2008-09, adds MHSA Wellness Centers – non-Client Run funds in the amount of \$558,300. The name of the service delivery site located at 15342 Hawthorne Boulevard, Suite 102, Lawndale, CA 90260, will change from Transitional Living Centers for L.A. County, Inc., PN 7162 to TLC Wellness Center. Adds Non-Medi-Cal services, Community Client Services (Mode 45, Service Function Code (SFC) 20) at a rate of \$51.70; Client Supportive Services (Mode 60, SFCs 64, 70-79) to PN 7162. For FYs 2007-08, 2008-09, and 2009-10, the total MCA will be increased by \$558,300 with a revised MCA of \$1,664,318, \$1,667,600, and \$1,667,600.
6. **Amendment No. 4 (MH120181) with The Guidance Center** moves the service delivery site from 369 W. Compton Blvd., Compton, CA 90220, to 901 W. Victoria Street, Units F & G, Compton, CA 90220, under existing PN 7279. The following services are to be provided at this site: TCMS, MHS, Therapeutic Behavioral Services, Medication Support, Crisis Intervention, Mental Health Promotion, Community Client Services, Case Management Support, and Client Supportive Services.
7. **Amendment No. 1 (MH120192) with Asian American Drug Abuse Program, Inc.**, Contractor moved its corporate office site from 5318 Crenshaw Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90043, to 2900 Crenshaw Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90016. There is no MHS provided at this corporate office site. There is no change in the MCA.
8. **Amendment No. 6 (MH120203) with ChildNet Youth and Family Services, Inc.**, adds Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Intensive In-Home Enhanced Specialized Foster Care funds in the amount of \$5,856; adds EPSDT-FFP funds in the amount of \$40,000; adds EPSDT-State General Funds (SGF) in the amount of \$34,144 for Intensive In-Home Mental Health Services

- provided under the Intensive Treatment Foster Care (ITFC) evidence-based practice service model. For FY 2007-08, the MCA will increase by \$80,000, with a revised MCA of \$7,682,146.
9. **Amendment No. 8 (MH120206) with Children's Institute, Inc.**, adds MHSA funds to provide Full Service Partnership (FSP) children slots in the amount of \$2,333, which is a correction adjustment to the total allocation of \$280,033 for Healthy Families Program. The revised MCA is \$15,088,865.
  10. **Amendment No. 6 (MH120226) with Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services** adds a new service site located at 44738 Sierra Highway, Lancaster, CA 93534, under a new PN. Services to be provided are Mode 15, SFC Ranges 01-09, 10-19/30-59, 58, 60-69 and 70-79; Mode 45, SFC Ranges 20-29. There will be no change to the MCA.
  11. **Amendment No. 3 (MH120233) with Intercommunity Child Guidance Center** adds MHSA Child FSP EPSDT FFP match funds in the amount of \$5,124; EPSDT-FFP in the amount of \$35,000; EPSDT-SGF in the amount of \$29,876; MHSA FSP Child Client Supportive Services in the amount of \$3,575; MHSA FSP Child MHS in the amount of \$7,000; and MHSA – Family Supportive Services in the amount of \$12,100 for a combined total increase of \$92,675 to the MCA. For FY 2008-09, the annual cost of the Children's FSP programs is \$370,000, which is fully funded by EPSDT-FFP Medi-Cal, EPSDT-SGF and MHSA CSS Plan funds. The MCA increases by \$92,675 for a revised MCA of \$4,446,747 and for FY 2007-08, the MCA increases by \$370,700 with a revised MCA of \$4,734,800.
  12. **Amendment No. 5 (MH120257) with St. Anne's Maternity Home** converts from Negotiated Rates (NR) to Provisional Cost Reimbursement (CR) Rates with revised rates for TCM (Mode 15, SFCs 01-09) from \$1.79 to \$2.02; MHS (Mode 15, SFCs 10-19/30-59) from \$2.32 to \$2.61; Medication Support (Mode 15, SFCs 60-69) from \$4.23 to \$4.82. The MCA remains unchanged at \$2,255,600.
  13. **Amendment No. 2 (MH120267) with Telecare Corporation** adds \$245,000 in CGF- Psychiatric Emergency Services (PES) funding to provide emergency MHS at the Mental Health Urgent Care Center. The revised MCA for FY 2007-08 is \$10,577,700.
  14. **Amendment No. 1 (MH180009) with Jackson & Coker, LLC**, for FYs 2007-08 and 2008-09, increases the contracted daily rate from \$1,050 to \$1,600; increases the weekday hourly rate to \$200 for the difficult-to-recruit

locations in the Antelope Valley only; adds Local Small Business Enterprise Preference Program language; and revises the Safely Surrendered Baby Law Program Fact Sheet.

***The following two (2) amendments to LE Agreements (15 to 16) decrease the NR due to the elimination of the Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for the period of March 1, 2008, to June 30, 2008:***

16. **Amendment No. 3 (MH120265) with Sunbridge Harbor View Rehabilitation Center dba Harbor View Adolescent** decreases the NR/Provisional CR Rates for the following SD/MC services: Day Treatment Intensive – Full Day (Mode 10, SFCs 85-89) from \$107.73 to \$104.79; TCMS (Mode 15, SFCs 01-09) from \$1.17 to \$1.14; MHS (Mode 15, SFCs 10-19/30-59) from \$1.54 to \$1.50; and Medication Support (Mode 15, SFCs 60-69) from \$2.81 to \$2.73. The MCA shall remain the same for FY 2007-08.

***The following two (2) amendments to LE Agreements (17 to 18) change the method of reimbursement from NR to CR for the following SD/MC services for FYs 2007-08, 2008-09, and 2009-10:***

For FYs 2007-08 and 2008-09, the MCA shall remain the same.

21. **Amendment No. 9 (MH120261) with Star View Adolescent Center, Inc.,** for FY 2007-08, the MCA increased by \$100,000 with a revised MCA of \$27,398,003.

***The following four (4) amendments to LE Agreements (22 to 25) increase/decrease/shift current California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) funding for MHS and/or Community Outreach Services (COS):***

The combined increase and decrease of CalWORKs funding will not change the MCA. The revised CalWORKs funding for MHS will be \$672,000 and for COS will be \$40,000. For FYs 2007-08, 2008-09, and 2009-10, the revised MCA will be \$27,900,595, \$27,486,600, and \$27,317,300.
23. **Amendment No. 2 (MH120215) with El Centro de Amistad, Inc.,** decreases current CalWORKs funding for MHS by \$20,000. The revised CalWORKs funding for MHS will be \$220,000 with a revised MCA of \$2,132,130 and \$2,143,100, respectively.
24. **Amendment No. 4 (MH120233) with Intercommunity Child Guidance Center** increased CalWORKs MHS funding by \$50,000 with a revised MCA of \$4,496,747.
25. **Amendment No. 2 (MH120279) with Verdugo Mental Health Center** shifts current CalWORKs funding for COS by \$15,000 and to CalWORKs funding for MHS. The revised CalWORKs funding for MHS will be \$242,750 and for COS will be \$7,250. The MCA for FYs 2007-08 and 2008-09 will remain the same.

***The following four (4) amendments to LE Agreements (26-29) eliminate the Home Health Market Basket COLA of 2.80 percent for all SD/MC Mode 10 and Mode 15 services and also decrease the NR for the following SD/MC services:***
