Prerequisite: Completed the “Applying the Risk-Need-Responsivity (RNR) Principles in Your Practice” training.

This training instructs forensic mental health staff on the use of the Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI) assessment tool and its integration in the RNR practice model. The following topics are covered: Historical Background of the LS/CMI, review of the Three Stages of a Semi-Structured Interview, application of Effective Interviewing Skills using Active Listening Skills (OARS), and administration, scoring, and assessment of consumer’s risk level and treatment needs. The Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI) is a comprehensive case management tool developed to assist in treatment of adult and late adolescent male and female consumers in correctional and forensic mental health agencies. It is a structured interview with a detailed survey of risk and need factors. It is intended to enhance quality of case management, treatment planning, and service delivery. Upon completion of the training, participants will competently integrate RNR principles into practice and complete all the requirements for the LS/CMI user qualification.
