	 Pharmacy Updates Pharmacy services office is conducting clinical monitoring of Prescription Drug Prior Authorization (PA) requests for FY 2017-2018. During This period, 450 PA requests were received; 50% approved and 50% requests denied due to missing key information/mandatory fields (e.g., rationale for medication, no diagnoses, no MD signature, missing client identifiers) or using incorrect/old PA form. Requests were also denied due to clt had alternative insurance coverage or not located in IBHIS. Pharmacy services provides same day response and clear reasons for denials. Providers are advised to check IBHIS/Avatar for accuracy of client info and submit PA request forms completed accurately to help streamline approval process. 		
	 Patients' Rights Updates Discussed that SAs have not received Change of Provider reports for several months so unable to follow up with providers if there are missing logs. Not sure if providers are receiving confirmation receipts via email. Date unknown for when LE's will go live with the online reporting system

- At the monthly chairs mtg, QA discussed and provided clarification re: substance abuse treatment provided by substance abuse counselors. Substance abuse service itself is not an allowable specialty mental health service. Even with the best documentation, substance abuse treatment/substance abuse groups are not considered Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS). Discussed if COD groups are claimable. Better case if you have a mental health clinician leading/co-leading the group and primary purpose is clearly to treat the mental health issue. Using TCM to link clients to substance abuse treatment services. More clarification will be provided in a bulletin.
- Discussed at chairs mtg about Seeking Safety –
 QA advised that services such as relapse
 prevention focused solely on the
 addiction/substance abuse and not the primary
 mental health condition will elicit a denial not
 necessarily due to the rendering provider being a
 substance abuse counselor. However, it was
 discussed at the chairs mtg regarding if substance
 abuse counselors are trained in the rehab option
 and mental health to understand how their
 expertise allows for effective mental health service.
- Dr. Brad Bryant recommends that substance use counselors are paired with mental health clinicians to provide expertise in a service that is primarily focused on mental health services
- If we provide these services even if we do not bill, we may be at risk of holding ourselves out as substance use treatment provider and subjecting ourselves to 42 CFR part 2

- private insurance may require add-on codes. If you're encountering issues, contact QA to talk it through (DMH and DHCS do not technically have the ability to manage add-on codes).
- DHCS understands we plan to bill all psych testing minutes to Medi-Cal.

Proposed Guide to Procedure Codes update

- Nurses (Registered Nurse Scope of Practice 302.06 L1)
 - removing authorized designation for RN,
 NP and Clinical Nurse Specialist
 - Advanced Practice NP and CNP can claim 90791 and 90792
 - will be changes to practitioner enrollment
- Collateral definition expanding to include significant support staff, consistent with state definition of collateral (e.g., teachers, staff who are being paid).
 Make sure it's on the treatment plan.
- Assessment 90791 expanded to include gathering of information for purpose of assessment, not just face-to-face (CPT doesn't require FTF for assessment)
 - Looking to add nursing assessment code for RNs
 - Other disciplines who gather information to inform mental health assessment another code will be added for them (a nonclinical assessment code)
- For purpose of plan development use H0032 code
- For purpose of mental health intervention -Collateral
- For purpose of assessment Assessment code
- Hopefully will get finalized and posted by end of month
- Will look at how the changes in assessment (not requiring FTF) change the episode opening date and timely access to care requirements
- Policy on opening/closing episodes still being finalized

Reminder: Medication Consent Requirements

 acceptable to include attestation that the difference components were addressed without identifying all the specific details (don't have to list dosage and frequency, but do need to identify the medication) -

so don't have to get a new consent if the dosage changes (unless you listed it on the form - better to identify that it's covered via attestation)

Katie A Subclass Verification Bulletin

- From a 2013 DHCS info notice
- Why isn't FSP listed? Will get clarification
- Completed upon intake for any client under 21, medical necessity, open child welfare case
 - o If new child welfare court case is opened
 - If new treatment conditions exist, e.g., needing more intensive service

Consent for Secure Texting

 HIPAA Bridge is the secure texting platform used by DMH

Psychiatry Residents providing E&M MSS

 Can only provide SMHS/MSS eval and management when supervised in their residency programs. To provide services: must be a psychiatrist in the system as a psychiatrist and need to have completed a psychiatry residency or student with supervision, receiving supervision

Health Information Management (D.O. only)

- HIM Clinical Record Management and Process Training, now monthly
- Working on cleaning up duplicate client records which has become a critical problem (There are 25,000 duplicate records). Need to fix so unable to create duplicate records. Important to use government issued ID to minimize record errors
- Effective handling of subpoenas/collection of statutory witness and mileage fees for clinicians' deposition appearances

	 Depositions are different from regular subpoenas. County counsel may be contacted for assistance. Photocopy fees for records was discussed as governed by State law. Absolutely no fees for verbal disclosures.
