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About the Center

The Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (LACDMH) San Antonio Family Center (SAFC) was transformed from a directly operated adult clinic to a children's clinic in 1985, and was housed in a free standing building in Bell Gardens for 20 years. Since then, SAFC has provided services to children and adolescents birth to transitional age youth who are experiencing severe emotional disturbances. San Antonio Family Center has been based in Bell Gardens, Santa Fe Springs and its present home in Huntington Park.

The new SAFC facility was officially dedicated on January 28, 2009.

Services are available in English, Spanish, and other languages based on need.

Eligibility

Children/Adolescents ages birth to 21 years. Clients must meet medical necessity criteria and the disturbance in behavior must cause impairment in academic, social, and/or occupational functioning. SAFC also offers mental health support services to adults who are referred through the Los Angeles County Department of Public Social Services CalWORKs and GAIN programs.

Community Partnerships

SAFC accepts referrals from all community schools in service area 7. Staff participates in community Health Fairs and School Fairs to promote awareness of Mental Health Services.
