Services provided at LBCAP include individual therapy, family therapy, group therapy, rehabilitation services, targeted case management, medication management and support, and CaIWORKs/Supported Employment Services Workshops.

Students will have the opportunity to learn group therapy by co-facilitating different groups at LBCAP such as Art Empowerment, parenting (English and Spanish), DBT Informed, Juvenile Justice, Incredible Years, and Life Skills.

What evidence based practices or theoretical orientations will students be exposed to at this site?

CBT, Incredible Years, TF-CBT, Triple P, DBT, Seeking Safety, Managing and Adapting Practices.

Do students have the opportunity to work in a multidisciplinary team environment that includes those with lived experience?

Yes, clinical workers, psychiatrists, medical case workers, substance abuse counselor and parent partner psychologists, social.

Occasionally, students will provide services at the client's home or school – this is very rare. Also, we may continue to provide services via telehealth.
