SCVMHC provides a variety of mental health services, which include intake and assessments, case management, crisis intervention, medication support, peer support and substance abuse counseling. SCVMHC emphasizes Co-Occurring Disorders, Prevention and Early Intervention Plans and offers a variety of group therapy.

What are the most frequent diagnostic categories of your client population?

We are a specialty mental health facility providing services to adults with severe and persistent mental illness (e.g. Schizophrenia, Bipolar Disorders, Psychotic Disorders, PTSD, Borderline Personality Disorder, Anxiety Disorders, Major Depression Disorder).

What specific (perhaps unique) training opportunities do students have at your agency?

Students will have the opportunity to work with a diverse treatment team consisting of Licensed Social Workers, Psychologists, Psychiatrists, Nurses, Substance Abuse Counselors and Peers. Students may have Micro/Macro opportunities in their field placements. Students will receive appropriate training and supervision and may have the opportunity to participate in an Evidenced-Based therapeutic training.

What evidence based practices or theoretical orientations will students be exposed to at this site?

CBT, DBT, Seeking Safety, CORS, Problem Solving Therapy, and Prolonged Exposure Therapy.

Do students have the opportunity to work in a multidisciplinary team environment that includes those with lived experience?

Yes. SCVMHC has a growing peer program. Clinic runs Client Advisory Board meetings monthly. We have a weekly group facilitated by an individual with lived experience.

List locations where students will be providing services **other than agency?**

SCVMHC services are provided within outpatient clinic. FSP services are provided within the clinic and in the field, but it's more likely the opening for the student will be in the outpatient clinic.
