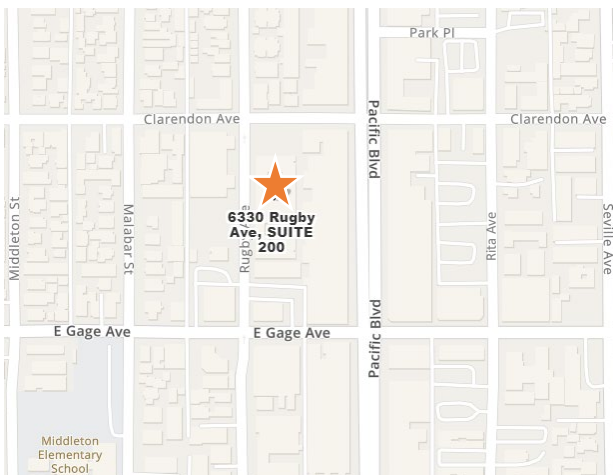

The PRC is not only a comfortable, safe, and non-judgmental environment for all who enter, but is also a place with intention. The Peer staff and volunteers use their lived experience to help make visitors feel welcomed, accepted, and supported. Every visitor will feel assured that they will leave with the appropriate community referrals they need while also developing a positive connection with LACDMH and the Peers at the Center.

The Power of Peer Support

The Peer Resource Center serves as a beacon of opportunity for Peers to extend a warm and caring welcome to those seeking mental health information and resources.

Through sharing the lived experience and first-hand knowledge of its Peer staff and volunteers, PRC will cultivate hope, recovery, and wellbeing in the surrounding community and throughout Los Angeles County.



Linkage to Services

Staff and Peer volunteers are available to offer linkage and warm handoffs to community organizations that can help address visitor needs.

Visitors can be linked to resources such as:

- Mental health services
- Physical health services
- Food
- Clothing
- Hygiene facilities
- Transportation
- Temporary shelter
- Housing services
- Benefits establishment
- Legal services
- Education and job training
- Volunteer and employment opportunities

Collaboration with other public and private social service agencies is a vital component of this program. Social service departments and organizations will also be invited to the Center to provide office hours and workshops to encourage engagement of visitors. The PRC is staffed in part by Wellness Outreach Worker (WOW) Volunteers from all over the County who bring resources from their Service areas and their lived experience to share with the community.
