Background

- CPT is DMH's process for engaging a diverse stakeholder group that provides input, feedback and recommendations about critical issues and service gaps that are MHSA and Non-MHSA related
- Goal of the CPT is to build capacity for existing community/stakeholder groups' (e.g. SALTs, UsCCs, Peer Advisory, Co-Chairs and Liaisons) to represent critical issues that impact their communities
 - 1. Monthly stakeholder meetings for SALTs, UsCCs and Advisory Groups are supported with facilitation to gather their feedback to share with the CPT.
 - 2. Outreach and Engagement staff are working on strategies to increase stakeholder and community participation in CPT and monthly stakeholder meetings
- CPT creates a space for stakeholders to discuss new proposals for programs and services that may address service gaps identified during the CPT meetings.

 caregivers, and peers




- Meaningful engagement opportunities: input and recommendations through larger group sessions and 4 smaller focused workgroups

CPT DESIGN

UNIVERSAL CITATION: 9 CA Code of Regs 3200.270

The State Code of Regulations for MHSA names specific stakeholder groups that must be involved in the community process.



Stakeholder Groups

- Individuals with serious mental illness and/or serious emotional disturbance and/or their families;
- Providers of mental health and/or related services such as physical health care and/or social services;
- Educators and/or representatives of education;
- Representatives of law enforcement;
- Any other organization that represents the interests of individuals with serious mental illness/ and/or serious emotional disturbance and/or their families.

Membership and Participation As of October 26, 2023

- Of total 121 seats:
 - 92 slots filled
 - 20 alternates
 - 9 Vacant
- 17 Mental Health Commission selected seats filled with individuals with lived experience:
 - -10 filled
 - -6 alternates
 - -1 vacant
- Diversity Survey:
 - 61 total completed Diversity Survey,
 - 60 still need to complete Diversity Survey

Involvement/Selection of CPT Members with lived experience:

- 2 voting seats and 1 alternate filled from the DMH Peer Specialists Workgroup
- 9 voting seats and 5 alternates filled by the Mental Health Commission for representative categories that focused on selecting individuals with lived experience:
 - 1. Community Health Workers/Promotoras (2 seats and 1 alternate filled)
 - 2. Housing and Homelessness(1 Voting seat and 1 alternate filled)
 - 3. Peer Specialist (2 Voting seats and 1 alternate filled)
 - 4. Service Provider staff (1 voting seat and 1 alternate filled)
 - 5. Veterans (2 voting seats and 1 alternate filled)





MARCH: Los Angeles County Mental Health Commission's review of the proposed MHSA Three-Year Plan.
