Mental Health Commission (MHC) Priorities

The MHC has established two priorities along with targets for each priority.

While various priorities are interconnected and crucial, the following list represents the most pertinent areas that need immediate attention for the MHC. These targeted areas are intended to streamline the commission's efforts towards achieving established goals.



ADMINISTRATIVE

1. In the presumed aftermath of Proposition 1, the Commission is to gain a better understanding of fiscal impacts to our local contract providers and identify the providers that would take the biggest hit.
2. Identify alternative funding sources to address the Proposition 1 shortfall including drawing down federal funds.
3. Dialogue with the Board of Supervisors relative to potential Proposition 1 shortfall.
4. Better understanding of what Cal-AIM to our current providers
5. Commissioners to seek clarification on budget formulation and reimbursement processes. How do we reduce red tape on releasing SALT funds?



OUTREACH

1. Improve the overall communication between DMH-MHC-Board of Supervisors. Commissioners work to have regular meetings with their Supervisorial deputies.
2. Facilitate regular meetings between Lisa Wong, DMH Director, and the MHC.
3. Develop active participation between the MHC with SALTs, USCCs, MHSA Community Planning Team.
4. Discuss holding occasional evening meetings so the public could participate.
5. Develop and email list from each district.
6. Commissioners should actively participate in local SALTs and health neighborhoods.
