Missing and murdered indigenous women and girls represent the continuum of violence related to sexual assault, sex trafficking, domestic violence, stalking and dating violence. An overview of Domestic Violence as well as information on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls will be discussed. This training will also address advocacy, resources, shelters, and other information associated with Native Domestic Violence programs.
