## **Co-Chair Updates**

- Co-chair updated the subcommittee regarding the recent CCC/UsCC Leadership meetings where the capacity building project guidelines and bylaws were reviewed and discussed, as well as voting criteria and eligibility for co-chairs.
- Co-chair highlighted the need for a subcommittee leadership plan as both co-chairs will end their terms around August.
- This subcommittee is looking for a delegate to participate in the regular MHSA CPT meetings. Kelly to send out a request to members.

# FY 24-25 Capacity Building Projects – Targeted Communities – Discussion

- Drag performers (explore economic and health disparities)
- Interfaith dialogues (in particular focused on Palestinians and Jewish communities or another possibility is affirming ministry and the impact that has on mental health)
- Internet safety/mental health and social media (for example politically and civically engaged individuals are being doxxed at protests)
- Ballroom community
- Harm reduction fentanyl, education and awareness, Naloxone distribution
- Aging in place, how to plan for the future for folks who never thought they would make it
- Incarcerated people
- Pacific Islanders and Native Hawaiians
- Southwest Asian, North African, Middle Eastern
- Mixed race communities
- Voter knowledge (increasing awareness)

- Deaf and hard of hearing folks (i.e. training around sign language or MH providers or learning ASL for LGBTQ members in general)
- Polyamorous communities (something around stigma)
- Suicide awareness and prevention for LGBTQIA2-S youth
- Former foster and adoption youth (older now-certain experiences/traumas that they want to talk through)
- Unhoused populations, in particular elders (eviction moratorium ending, many families will be displaced, look at housing assistance/resources in all projects)
- Frontline workers (possible mental health and physical health impacts)
- Ace communities (education/awareness for communities in general, possible artistic project focused on ace communities)
- Physically disabled communities (possibly mobility programs to foster self-healing and empowerment)
- Grief support spaces for LGBTQIA2-S folks (different identities and ages, intergenerational support, many queer people don't see themselves living past 35, use different modalities like art making, poetry, movement, sound)
- TAY youth sexual and MH education around STI awareness and screenings
- Anti-trans and anti-drag legislation (individuals moving to CA because of targeted legislation such as trans youth or other groups that are specifically impacted)

#### **UsCC Retreat**

- Kelly shared regarding the opportunity for each UsCC to host a retreat focused on developing stakeholder priorities for the new year, creating an action plan, exploring short-term next steps/roles/responsibilities, and strengthening collaborative relationship among subcommittee members and DMH staff.
  - Kelly to send out a survey to members to gather feedback regarding particular dates, as well as catering and location recommendations
  - o Mirtala Parada Ward, ARDI Program Manager, to attend in March to share more about the retreat.

  - Transforming Community Care: API LGBTQ+ Mental Health and Wellness Project currently in second phase including participant recruitment. Vendor provided updates to subcommittee during meeting.
  - o Proyecto Mariposa Monarca currently in second phase including participant recruitment.
  - Two-Spirit Storytelling Project currently in third phase including Storyteller gatherings.
  - o Neurodivergent Voices Album Project preparing to begin first phase in March.
  - o LGBTQIA2-S Violence Prevention Lab Project currently in second phase including participant recruitment.

- LGBTQIA2-S Housing Listening Sessions Project wrapping up second phase including participant recruitment, session will begin in March.
- Liberation Workshop Series Project currently in second phase including participant recruitment.
