ASL Consumer Satisfaction</p>	<p>Dr. Sandra Chang from the Anti-Racism, Diversity, and Inclusion (ARDI) Division provided updates on the American Sign Language Services Satisfaction Survey (ASL SSS) data.</p>	<p>ARDI received positive feedback for the ASL services from the vendors requesting the services. There was a low number of surveys received directly from the ASL service users, ARDI will try to increase the number in order to gather the data. In terms of the mode of the ASL delivery, 78% were virtual ASL services, and 21% ASL in person services. They are seeing a trend where more clinics are requesting in person services, the challenge is interpreters tend to gravitate more towards virtual meetings versus in person services. Zoom was the more widely used platform followed by VSee, Microsoft Teams, and ending with other options.</p> <p>Mr. Alex Elliot shared that there are some Federal shortages and an even bigger shortage of sign language interpreters with mental health specialty recommending we should increase our capacity there. The FCC just made a ruling that platforms have to be more accessible in the next year. Also, there is a new sign language view on Teams, making it almost as good as Zoom.</p>	<p>Dr. Chang</p>

They were able to increase access to care in the outpatient system for this group, so that they wouldn't have to go through the expensive and restrictive environments of the inpatient that were in the residential system. Los Angeles County (LAC) volunteered to get mentoring from Solano County and wanted to align their work with Dr. Chang and the Cultural Competency Plan. In addition to that LAC is getting training through the University of California-Davis on their Center for Reducing Disparities to apply the class standards, the culturally and linguistically appropriate standards.
