## Migration Stories: Resilience and Challenges of Indigenous Peoples in LA County

This training session aims to shed light on the historical and contemporary experiences of Indigenous peoples in Los Angeles County. Participants will explore the resilience and challenges faced by Indigenous communities, particularly through the lens of 6<sup>th</sup> generation decent of Chief Red Cloud of the Great Oglala Lakota Nation. From ancestral homelands to urban centers, this training examines how Indigenous peoples have navigated displacement, preserved cultural practices, and fostered resilience in the face of adversity. This training will also aim to increase awareness among non-American Indian/Alaska Native individuals with information about the Tribal culture and how to provide American Indian/Alaska Native populations with culturally sensitive mental health services.

1. List historical events that have led to the migration of Indigenous peoples to Los Angeles County.

4. Describe ways the Indigenous peoples have preserved and adapted their cultural practices in new environments.
5. List contemporary issues: including land rights, health disparities, and cultural revitalization efforts, faced by Indigenous peoples in LA County.
