Racial Trauma in Cambodian Population and Implications for Clinical Work

This training will familiarize practitioners with the historical context, culture, and tradition that impacted the trauma and stigma among the Cambodian population. Mental health challenges experienced by the people in Cambodia as well as in the United States will be discussed. Participants will learn about the intergeneration transmission of trauma and the prevalent mental health challenges faced by the Cambodian population; this includes stigma and barriers to mental health. Through the use of case studies and examples, best practice culturally relevant interventions and strategies are discussed.

OBJECTIVES: As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:

1. Describe the historical context of the Cambodian population that impacted trauma and stigma
2. Explain common mental health challenges among the Cambodian population
3. List effective treatment strategies that meet cultural and mental health needs of the Cambodian population
