 - This report provides metrics from DMH and the Department of Public Health (DPH) for the programs located on the Martin Luther King Jr. Behavioral Health Center campus. Below are a few of those metrics.
 - DMH Crisis Residential Treatment Program:
 - ⊲ Received 53 referrals and 39 admissions.

 - No serious incidents (medical emergencies, suicide attempts or aggressive acts) during this period.
 - DPH Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and Respite and Recovery Center:
 Respite/Sobering Center:
 - Received 322 referrals.
 - Occupancy rate and average length of stay: 24% / 13 hours.
 - Residential Withdrawal Management (RWM):
 - Received 158 referrals.
 - Occupancy rate and average length of stay: 63%/6 days.
 - ⊲ Residential:
 - Received 294 referrals.
 - Occupancy rate and average length of stay: 89% / 70 days.
