Pupil Health: Opioid Antagonists

Provides that existing law authorizes school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools to provide emergency naloxone hydrochloride or another antagonist to school nurses or voluntary trained personnel. Requires each individual public school operated by a district, county office of education, or charter school that has elected to make a school nurse or trained personnel available at the school to maintain at least a specified number of units of naloxone hydrochloride or another antagonist.

Creates the Homeless Courts Pilot Program. Requires applicant cities or counties seeking grant funds to provide a number of specified services or program components, including, but not limited to, a diversion program enabling participating defendants to have specified charges dismissed upon completion of a program, provision of temporary, time-limited, or permanent housing during the duration of the program, and a dedicated representative to assist defendants with housing needs.

Code:

An act to add and repeal Chapter 5.5 (commencing with Section 5475) of Part 1 of Division 5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to the courts.

Requires the coordinator to perform prescribed duties, including, among others, identifying a local leader in each relevant city, county, or other jurisdiction to serve as a liaison between the coordinator and that jurisdiction and overseeing homelessness programs, services, data, and policies between federal, State, and local agencies.

Code:

An act to add Chapter 1.3 (commencing with Section 12095) to Part 2 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, relating to homelessness.

Public Postsecondary Education: Campus Mental Health

Requires the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges and the Chancellor of the California State University to develop a plan to make a campus mental health hotline that is operated by an organization with expertise in student mental health available to students on their respective campuses. Requires the Chancellors to each submit a report to the Legislature on the plan and on the other types of campus mental health hotlines that campuses make available to students.

Requires the State Department of Health Care Services to make grants, incentive payments, or other financial support available to Medi-Cal managed care plans to develop and implement reproductive and behavioral health integration pilot programs in partnership with identified qualified providers, in order to improve access to behavioral health services for beneficiaries with mild-to-moderate behavioral health conditions.

Code:

An act relating to behavioral health. to add Article 5.52 (commencing with Section 14184.811) to Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

Provides that under existing law, the principal and accumulated interest of a loan issued under the Multifamily Housing Program is due and payable upon the completion of the term of the loan. Prohibits, for the first specified number of years of the loan term, the amount of the required loan payments from exceeding a specified percent per annum or a specified amount per assisted unit, whichever is less.

Provides that existing law requires the Governor to create an Interagency Council on Homelessness, consisting of specified members, and provides specified goals for the council. Requires the council to include the Governor's Tribal Advisor. Requires the council to coordinate applications for funding. Requires council staff to develop and regularly maintain a strategic funding guide and a calendar of new or existing funding opportunities.

Controlled Substances: Psychedelic-Assisted Therapy

Provides that the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act categorizes certain drugs and other substances as controlled substances and prohibits various actions related to those substances. Requires the Health and Human Services Agency to convene a workgroup to study and make recommendations on the establishment of a framework governing psychedelic-assisted therapy. Authorizes the lawful use of hallucinogenic or psychedelic substances for psychedelic-assisted therapy.

Code:

An act to add Article 5 (commencing with Section 11260) to Chapter 5 of Division 10 of, and to add and repeal Section 11214 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to controlled substances.

Prohibits the board from reimbursing a person for a period of time exceeding the amount of time they were incarcerated.

Requires a general acute care hospital to adopt policies for behavioral health personnel to respond to patients with a mental health or substance use crisis. Requires all general acute care hospitals to maintain records on each patient who receives care from behavioral health response personnel and the number of hours of services provided for a period of a specified number of years.

An act to add Section 128740.1 to, and to add Article 7.1 (commencing with Section 1323.2) and Article 7.15 (commencing with Section 1323.4) to Chapter 2 of Division 2 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to health facilities.

Makes housing support services for specified populations a covered Medi-Cal benefit when the department has begun a specified evaluation required under the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal Waiver Special Terms and Conditions, and the Legislature has made an appropriation for purposes of the housing support services. Requires the department to seek federal approval for the housing support services benefit.

An act to amend Section 14124.16 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

Requires the commission to report to specified policy committees of the Legislature a statewide strategy to understand, communicate, and mitigate mental health risks associated with the use of social media by children and youth.

Emergency Services: Psychiatric Emergency Medical

Requires the Medi-Cal program to cover emergency services and care necessary to treat an emergency medical condition including all professional physical, mental, and substance use treatment services. Requires coverage for emergency services necessary to relieve or eliminate a psychiatric emergency medical condition. Requires a Medi-Cal managed care plan to be responsible for covering, and reimbursing providers for furnishing, those emergency services and care.

An act to amend Sections 1317.1, 1317.2a, 1317.4a, 1317.4b, and 1317.7 of the Health and Safety Code, and to add Section 14132.025 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to health care.

Relates to the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal initiative to improve quality outcomes and reduce health disparities. Requires, with respect to behavioral health services provided under the Medi-Cal program, the State Department of Health Care Services to standardize data elements relating to documentation requirements, including, but not limited to, medically necessary criteria, and requires the department to develop standard forms containing information necessary to properly adjudicate claims.

An act to amend Section 14184.402 of, and to add Section 14184.406 to, the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

Criminal Procedure: Competence to Stand Trial

Provides that existing law prohibits a person from being tried or adjudged to punishment while that person is mentally incompetent. Provides that existing law requires a court to appoint 2 mental health professionals to examine a defendant if the defendant is seeking a finding of mental incompetence. Requires the appointment of a 2nd mental health professional only if requested by the defendant.

The Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2024

Enacts the Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2024, which, if adopted, would authorize the issuance of bonds in a specified amount pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. Provides that proceeds from the sale of these bonds would be used to finance programs to fund affordable rental housing and homeownership programs, including, among others, the Multifamily Housing Program, the CalHome Program, and the Joe Serna, Jr. Farmworker Housing Grant Program.

Code:

An act to add Part 16.1 (commencing with Section 54050) to Division 31 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to housing, by providing the funds necessary therefor through an election for the issuance and sale of bonds of the State of California and for the handling and disposition of those funds, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Authorizes counties to establish mental health multidisciplinary personnel teams to facilitate the expedited identification, assessment, and linkage of justice-involved persons diagnosed with a mental illness to supportive services within that county while incarcerated and upon release from county jail and to allow provider agencies and members of the personnel team to share confidential information for the purpose of coordinating supportive services to ensure continuity of care.

An act to add Part 9 (commencing with Section 5990) to Division 5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to mental health.

Prohibits a medical service plan and a health insurer from subjecting a naloxone product or another opioid antagonist approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration, or a buprenorphine product or long-acting injectable naltrexone for detoxification or maintenance treatment of a substance use disorder, to prior authorization or step therapy.

Makes these provisions subject to an appropriation.
