



#### Population by Age Group











#### Population by Gender









# Age Group Distribution among Los Angeles County's Medi-Cal Eligibles







#### Race/Ethnicity Distribution among Los Angeles County's Medi-Cal Eligibles









### MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) CLIENT COUNT FISCAL YEAR 2023-24








# RACE/ETHNICITY COMPARISON BY POPULATION AND CLIENTS SERVED



# Community Services and Supports (CSS)






# Prevention and Early Intervention: Early Intervention


# PEI – EARLY INTERVENTION UNIQUE CLIENTS SERVED BY FISCAL YEAR




# PEI Unique Clients Served by Service Area



Los Angeles County unsheltered homeless dropped by **5.1%**, while the number of people in shelter rose by **12.7%** in CY 2024\*.










