Welcome and	Racquel Decipeda welcomed all and reviewed the disability etiquette.

Land	Dr. Jennifer Alquijay gave the land acknowledgment.

Approve October	Racquel called for a motion to approve the October meeting minutes. Maria Elena Arauco
Meeting Minutes	motioned to approve, seconded by Cody Hanable. The motion passed with no objection.
Five Acres	Amy Kay shared a presentation on mental health services for the deaf and hard of hearing in
Presentation by Amy	LA County. She gave an overview of Five Acres, an organization that provides early
Kay	intervention and behavioral health services. Five Acres focused on Service Area 3 (San
,	Gabriel Valley) but offers telehealth countywide. The services provided include mental health
	assessments, therapy, psychiatric services, and case management. Services are available in
	ASL, English, Spanish, and other languages through interpreters. Five Acres staff utilize

trauma-informed care and evidence-based practices (e.g., CBT, family therapy). They have intensive care coordination with schools, regional centers, and DCFS. They provide support for deaf families, including hearing parents of deaf children or vice versa. Eligibility Criteria: • Children (0-21) and deaf adults (21+) with LA County Medi-Cal. • Services are continuous until the end of care, emphasizing skill-building for independence. As a result of COVID-19, Five Acres expanded telehealth services, making psychiatric and therapy support more accessible. Junko Nagamatsu highlighted a lack of psychiatric and therapy support for deaf clients in other counties. DMH Quarterly Christina Myers and Nour Bouchakra from the organization, Idea Hall, shared the relaunch of Stakeholder the quarterly newsletter to amplify stakeholder voices and share community stories. Newsletter Relaunch There will be open submissions for articles, poetry, art, recipes, and personal reflections. A Presentation by \$50 stipend will be awarded to contributors whose work is published. Themes will be Christina Myers and announced quarterly, and content will be translated into Spanish, Korean, and other Nour Bouchakra of threshold languages. Regarding accessibility, the newsletter will be available for digital and Idea Hall print distribution (DMH website, clinics, and community spaces). Videos with use captioning and/or ASL for online publication. • First call for submissions: January 10, 2025. • Deadline: January 31, 2025. • Newsletter launch: February 2025. Racquel asked about distribution and inclusion of organization updates. Junko advocated for video content and resources for the deaf community. Voting Accessibility Raquel shared her experience using a digital "full pass" ballot with a QR code. This allowed Discussion her to pre-mark her choices independently, enhancing her voting experience. Junko shared the historic lack of adequate accessibility for deaf and hard-of-hearing (DHH) voters at polling places has led to GLAD becoming a voting center. Prior volunteers were not well trained to communicate with DHH voters. This year, the Registrar-Recorder volunteers used a machine for video remote interpretation in ASL. This relieved the necessity for GLAD staff to assist with communication.

Co-chair Update	Héctor Manuel Ramírez emphasized the importance of mindfulness, nature, and peer support during challenging times. They encouraged attendees to connect others to community meetings for support. Héctor highlighted the risk of losing disability protections under the incoming federal administration and shared work with California legislators to preserve healthcare access and ADA protections. Héctor encouraged proactive community resilience and resource-sharing. They also shared a November 14th seminar featuring indigenous disability advocates and traditional healing methods covered by Medi-Cal.
