Introductions	Racquel Decipeda facilitated introductions.
Approve August	Racquel Decipeda called for motion to approve the August meeting minutes. Lourdes Rabello
Meeting Minutes	motioned to approve, seconded by Fran Sereseres. The motion passed with no objection.
Co-Chair Update: Nominations and Elections Discussion	Hector shared that due to accessibility issues the co-chairs have not been able to attend the in-person Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Community Planning Team/SALT-UsCC joint leadership meetings at St. Anne's Conference and Event Center. They asked the members if anyone would like to represent Access for All UsCC at these meetings on behalf of the co-chairs and the membership at large. No one volunteered, however Cultural Competency Committee (CCC) co-chair, Wendy Cabil, shared that she attends the meetings and tries to

	stand in the gap and uplift and uphold those with physical disabilities. Keianna Crenshaw

	Dr. Alquijay concluded by sharing that we cannot allow AI in meetings. For those using AI
	for accommodations, the live transcription and recording of the session is available. The
	reason is because AI compromises the security for the county, and we have been hacked
	and there is a lot of confidential information and overall security for the county,
	ransomware, etc. At this time, we are not allowing AI in the meetings.
	Alex Elliott gave an update on the Access Board, an independent federal agency tasked with
	promoting equality for people with disabilities through leadership and accessible design and
	development of accessibility guidelines and standards. Alex recapped they signed an MOU to
	give recommendations about artificial intelligence. Alex shared the deadline to give feedback
	was August 31 st and is now October 31 st .
	Alex shared resources for accessible voting from the Registar-Recorder and the Department
	of Aging and Disabilities.
	Alex shared a resource from the Department of Public Health regarding their homebound
	vaccination program. Los Angeles County residents can sign up for vaccination at home in 2
	ways: Residents with disabilities or without computer access can call 1-833-540-0473 7 days
	a week for assistance with submitting a request, or Fill out the online request form (the form
	has multiple language options) https://redcap.link/vaxathome
	Finally, Alex shared the ADA unit is actively working with the training department on
	developing an SOW for the ADA 101 training.
Presentation from	Amy Castro, Program Manager, shared the work of 211 LA, a nonprofit organization that

The presentation also emphasized the importance of partnerships and the comprehensive information and referral services provided by 211 LA in Los Angeles County.
