## **Description of Site:** (Please describe the type of Agency setting and services offered)

We are co-located within the West Los Angeles DCFS office in Service Area 5 and are a directly-operated LAC-DMH site that focuses on children and families involved with DCFS; providing screening/triage, assessment, individual and family therapy as well as case management services for children/families with open DCFS cases as well as on-site clinical consultation with DCFS staff. Our work is trauma-informed and highly collaborative, working closely with DCFS partners working to best meet the multifaceted needs of the child and family. As such, we attend multidisciplinary case consultation/staffing meetings and Child and Family Team (CFT) meetings with staff from various county departments (eg. DCFS, DPSS, LACOE, DPH) as well as service providers. Our child clients range from 0-18 as well as Non-Minor Dependents (NMD) age 18 - 21; however due to the supervisor's expertise in infant/early childhood mental health students can expect on emphasis on learning/carrying cases, for children age 0-5. Our services are provided on-site at the DCFS office as well as field-based; at homes, schools, shelters etc.

### What specific (perhaps unique) training opportunities do students have at your agency?

Broadly, students can expect a cohort practicum program with weekly didactic trainings including an emphasis on trauma-informed care, EBPs, substance use, diagnosis, documentation and TAY and Birth-5 populations, along with students placed at other LAC-DMH sites, countywide.

Students at our site, can expect an emphasis on infant/early childhood mental health including, but not limited to; perinatal mental health and dyadic (parent-child) therapy as well as exposure to use of tools such as the Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health & Developmental D/Os of Infancy & Early Childhood (DC: 0-5), Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQ-3 & ASQ-SE), among others. Opportunities for exposure to dyadic interventions using Infant Massage may include "side by side" field response with the supervisor as student interest and clinical need arises. Additional opportunities for learning/shadowing the direct supervisor related to her oversight/management of the SA5 Multidisciplinary Assessment Teams (MAT) for all newly detained children by DCFS in the service area, may also arise.

#### What evidence based practices or theoretical orientations will students be exposed to at this site?

Students will have on-site opportunities for exposure to Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP), Infant Massage and Play Therapy with caregivers and young children age 0-5 as well as TF-CBT for ages 3-21. Additional cohort trainings may include Seeking Safety and CBT/DBT. Students will participate in group supervision and be exposed to the use of Reflective Supervision with their direct supervisor.

Do students have the opportunity to work in a multidisciplinary team environment that includes those with lived experience?

Our work is highly collaborative and multidisciplinary. Students can expect to work closely with other DMH psychologists and staff (eg. LCSW/LMFT, Community Workers etc) as well as DCFS staff (CSW, SCSW, DI, ARA, Parent Partners), staff from other co-located departments (DPSS, LACOE, DPH) and other outside service providers and partners (eg. contract mental health agencies, Regional Center etc).
