Description of Site: (Please describe the type of Agency setting and services offered)

San Fernando Child and Family Center (SFCFC) is a Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health directlyoperated clinic. We are an outpatient therapeutic program that provides individual therapy, family therapy, group therapy, medication support services, case management, and consultation services. On occasion, field work is required including observation in the school setting, participation in educational IEPs, and/or home visits. Collaboration is often required with other specialized mental health programs such as TBS, FSP, residential treatment, Wraparound, and also with the DCFS. In addition, individual team members have weekly rotational responsibilities related to the Officer of the Day (OD) duties, such as telephone intake screening, walk in evaluations and assessments, crisis intervention, and coordination of LPS 5585/5150 evaluation and assessment by a licensed clinician for application for hospitalization when criterion are met for danger to self, others, and/or grave disability.
