As a result, the training will ensure that Peers develop increased confidence, competence, and skill in providing support, empowerment, and advocacy to community members seeking mental health and Peer Support services.

- 1. Develop ethical decision-making skills and ethical standards related to Peer Support services and common ethical dilemmas encountered in the field.
- 2. Develop understanding of ethics, boundaries, and confidentiality as it applies to the peer recovery specialist role.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate interventions through experiential and small group learning opportunities.
- 4. Identify appropriate interventions involving ethical dilemmas in presented case examples.
- 5. Discuss various topics of self-awareness and its applicability in the provision of Peer Support services.
- 6. Explain what the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) is.
