LITERACY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM: Trained volunteers provide one-on-one tutoring to build the reading and writing skills learners need to reach their personal and professional goals.

CAREER ONLINE HIGH SCHOOL: This self-paced, fully online program offers adults (ages 19 and up) the opportunity to earn a fully accredited high school diploma and a career certificate.

COMPUTER CLASSES: Library staff teach hands-on classes covering the computer skills needed to succeed at home, work, or school.

TECH & TASKS: Trained volunteers offer one-on-one assistance navigating websites and forms, using devices, writing resumes or letters, reading documents, and other tasks involving reading and writing.

ESL CONVERSATION & CITIZENSHIP CLASSES: Santa Monica Adult Education Center instructors teach ongoing classes at the Library.

ESL TUTORING PROGRAM: Trained volunteers provide one-on-one tutoring to help intermediate-advanced English learners improve their English conversation skills.

FAMILY LITERACY: Family programming, Reading-2-Go kits, and interactive ReadyRosie videos support your child's learning and love of reading.
