

About

San Fernando Child and Family Center (SFCFC) was originally a small program under the San Fernando Mental Health Clinic, a directly operated Adult Program. LA County broke ground on the new Sheila Kuehl Family Wellness Center on January 12, 2018, which houses SFCFC.

The SFCFC is designed to support the vision of making a difference in the lives of those young Los Angelenos seeking out services, treating diagnosed symptoms and behaviors, and providing a safe, caring environment that is inviting, community-oriented, inclusive, and promoting wellness.

Service are provided by a trained and experienced multi-disciplinary treatment team composed of psychiatrists, psychologists, clinical social workers, medical case workers, substance abuse counselors, community workers, and financial and business office staff.

Services Provided

- Children birth to five with behavioral, social, and/or parental, challenges
- Youth 6-21 with behavioral problems or experiencing other mental health symptoms
- Children and families with Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) involvement
- Children and families with Department of Probation involvement
- Children have socio-emotional difficulties in school and/or school
- Individual, family, and group therapy
- Psychiatric hospitalization (evaluation and referral)
- Psychiatric evaluation and medication
- Psychological testing, as needed
- Psycho-educational groups for family members
- Wellness activities and referrals
- Substance abuse education and counseling
