

TIES for Families – South Bay is a DMH directly operated children’s clinic in Torrance. The population served at TIES for Families-South Bay includes high-risk infants, young children, and adolescents. Many clients are involved with DCFS and have histories of pre-natal substance exposure and trauma. TIES for Families offers adoption-specific therapy for children who are being adopted through the DCFS system. Services available include: individual therapy, dyadic therapy, family therapy, group therapy, psychiatric services, developmental and psychological evaluations, and consultation and coordination of care across the systems serving the general community
