

Transportation Pathways to Crisis Services:

- **Non-Ambulance Transport for Clients on a 5150**
 - Can be provided by law enforcement when they are involved
 - Can be provided by two county staff in county vehicles for cooperative clients
- **Non-Emergency Ambulance Transport for Clients on a 5150**
 - Coordinated through ACCESS
 - Allows for the team starting the hold to follow a variety of pathways to access LPS-designated facilities where a bed is available
- **Emergency Ambulance Transport for Clients on a 5150**
 - Coordinated through 911
 - Transports client to the nearest emergency room

Note: Selected client transportation option should be informed by essential considerations discovered during the evaluation process (e.g., someone with acute medical needs should be transported via a method that can appropriately address medical complications).

Impacts to transportation:

- Clients who refuse transport
- Ways to address client disengagement
