Services for children and families include assessment and diagnosis, individual, collateral and family treatment, group treatment, crisis intervention, medication support and case management. *The CalWORKs adult program services individuals experiencing barriers to employment. Services include assessment, diagnosis, individual treatment, medication management, case management and assistance with employment.
