Description of Site: *(Please describe the type of Agency setting and services offered)*

Sheriff Mental Evaluation Team (MET) is a co-response and mutual-aid model of Deputy from Sheriff and one Department Mental Health Clinician to provide immediate field response to situations involving mentally ill, violent, or high risk or suspected mentally ill individuals called upon by patrol officer due to 911 calls in the Sheriff covered areas throughout the Los Angeles County.

Sheriff MET has started Risk Assessment and Management Program (RAMP) from 10/01/2018 to provide effective case management of selected referrals involving high utilizers of emergency services, high utilizers of 911 systems, and individuals who are at high risk of death or injury to themselves or others. RAMP provides linkage to mental health and other community services for the purpose of stabilization. RAMP criteria include high utilizers of emergency services, involved in a SWAT call out, communicated desire for "suicide by cop", targeted school violence, increasing high risk behaviors, prohibitor possessor Guns/Weapons program, Veteran with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. RAMP receives referrals from various entities, including but not limited to, LASD Personnel, Board of Supervisors and DMH Administration

Due to highest level of crisis calls (911), we will only accept second year three MSW students given the intensity of the cases, high risk, immediate crisis field intervention. We will accept one student for MET program and two second year MSW students for our RAMP program.
