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Description of Site: *(Please describe the type of Agency setting and services offered)*

CARE court is a field-based program serving clients who have been petitioned in court to receive mental health treatment. The program is voluntary for clients who are 18 years or older, diagnosed with Schizophrenia or other psychotic disorders or Bipolar I with Psychotic features, currently experiencing symptoms and behaviors from severe mental illness, and are not stabilized in on-going voluntary treatment elsewhere. We provide medication support, individual therapy, skill building, substance use treatment, and case management services as part of a multi-disciplinary team. Clients typically have multiple problem areas including homelessness, poverty, trauma, and substance use. Candidates may look forward to being part of a multidisciplinary team providing services in the community. Candidates will have the opportunity to learn about outreaching to clients who are difficult to engage, providing intensive wrap around services, conducting intake assessments, diagnosing mental conditions, completing court reports, and testifying in a civil court proceeding.
