Victory Boulevard and Tampa Avenue.

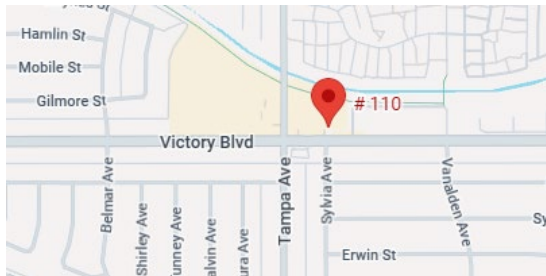
From 405 North

About

Valley Coordinated Children's Services (VCCS) seeks to improve the lives of young Angelenos by treating diagnosed symptoms and behaviors, and providing a safe, caring environment that is inviting, community-oriented, inclusive, and promotes wellness. Services are provided by a trained and experienced multidisciplinary treatment team composed of psychiatrists, psychologists, clinical social workers, medical case workers, and more.

Services Provided

- Outpatient Care Services for Children ages 0-5, youth ages 6-17, and young adults ages 18-20.
- Services for Children and families involved with the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) and/or the Department of Probation.
- Individual, family, and group therapy.
- Targeted Case Management Services.
- Psychiatric hospitalization (evaluation and referral).
- Psychiatric evaluation and medication.
- Psychological testing, as needed.
- Psycho-educational groups for family members.
- Wellness activities and referrals.

How to Request Services

Walk in or call our main number at (818) 708-4500 during business hours to discuss your child or adolescent's needs. Staff will speak with you and develop an appropriate plan for you and your child, which may include scheduling an intake admission appointment and/or help connect you with services that best fit your needs.

Who to Refer

We serve children and adolescents ages 0-17 who are experiencing behavioral, emotional or psychiatric challenges. Services may also be available to adults ages 18+, depending on the nature or severity of mental health concerns.

- Children who may be expressing that they want to die or hurt someone else.
- Children who report they are hearing or seeing things.
- Children at risk of psychiatric hospitalization.
- Children unable to function in the classroom due to behavioral or emotional problems.
- Children who may be at risk of hurting themselves or others.
- Children with an extensive treatment or hospitalization history.
- Children presenting with debilitating emotional difficulties.
- Children who may be expressing that they want to die or hurt someone else.
- Anyone needing consultation regarding mental illness or acute crisis in children.
