DESCRIPTION: This 201-level LGBTQIAS+ training will build upon foundational knowledge and foster a more inclusive and effective service environment. A 201-level training course will explore the specific challenges faced by subgroups within the LGBTQIAS+ community. Some of the key areas discussed will include subjects such as gender identity, sexual orientation, minority stress, trauma-informed care, and best practices. Providing real-world scenarios to reinforce learning and offer a list of LGBTQIAS+ affirming resources, referral networks, and guidelines. The training will allow staff to develop a nuanced understanding of how societal stigma, discrimination, and historical trauma impact mental health outcomes.

TARGET AUDIENCE: DMH & Contracted staff that deliver clinical and case management services related to clients

OBJECTIVES: As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:

1. Explain the complex and intersectional needs of the LGBTQIAS+ community.
2. Formulate a clinical case conceptualization that integrates at least two gender-affirming interventions and one culturally responsive framework.
3. List practical skills for crisis intervention, support, and advocacy for LGBTQIAS+ clients.
4. Identify strategies that promote a culture of inclusivity and respect.
5. Identify and address disparities in service delivery.
