DESCRIPTION: This training provides an overview of the Mini Mental State Exam (MMSE), a screening tool to measure cognitive impairment. The training reviews the purpose of the MMSE as a screening tool, outlines the cognitive domains and provides an opportunity to practice administering and scoring the MMSE. Social/cultural considerations relevant to tests use and interpretation of scores to the Los Angeles County mental health consumers are addressed. Other topics explore the interpretation of screening results such as cut-off scores, when to refer for additional testing, and relevance of strengths and weaknesses; video-taped sessions of MMSE administration are reviewed to promote knowledge and skill enhancement. Finally, testing considerations for differential diagnoses and treatment options are included in the discussion.

1. Explain how to administer, score and interpret performance on the MMSE.
2. Identify social/cultural considerations relevant to tests use and interpretation of scores to the Los Angeles County mental health consumers.
3. Identify at least five differential diagnoses that may be suggested by scores at or below cut-off on the MMSE.
4. Describe options available for further testing to clarify diagnosis and appropriate treatment.
