

Mediating Neurocognitive Impairments to Support Housing Retention

DESCRIPTION: This training will provide participants with an introductory understanding of how neurocognitive impairments commonly experienced by people labeled with psychiatric disabilities can impact functional success and define the need for support. Executive function, one aspect of cognition, has been shown to be a predictor of community living success for people labeled with psychiatric disabilities. Evidence-based approaches to addressing these neurocognitive impairments have been developed to minimize the impact of these impairments on daily life. These approaches include both remediation of the neurocognitive deficit itself and those that offer environmental/task compensatory/adaptative strategies. This training will focus on the latter as compensatory/adaptive strategies. Common neurocognitive impairments will be reviewed and matched with specific support strategies. Participants will also do problem solving around ways to support clients labeled with psychiatric disabilities who are also experiencing cognitive disruptions.

TARGET AUDIENCE: DMH and contracted staff providing housing-related supportive services.

OBJECTIVES: As a result of attending this training, participants should be able to:

1. Identify common neurocognitive impairments experienced by people labeled with psychiatric disabilities.
2. Discuss how these common cognitive disruptions may impact the daily housing residents/tenants.
3. Identify specific strategies for providing housing support targeting the common cognitive disruptions experienced by people labeled with psychiatric disabilities within the supported housing context.
