
Project Overview

The Strategic Growth Council (SGC) is awarding DPR \$1,000,000 to prepare Six Community Parks and Recreation Plans

- SGC received 110+ applications from cities and counties across California, of which only 27 are awarded funding
- DPR is the only park and recreation agency selected for the grant

Grant Objectives

- Create parks and green space
- Improve infrastructure
- Improve air and water quality
- Protect natural resources
- Promote water conservation and energy efficiency
- Help the economy



The LA Neighborhood Land Trust's communitybased process enables neighbors to take control of their environment and cultivate healthier lives.




Through grassroots efforts, residents help transform blighted vacant land into urban parks and gardens that inspire pride throughout the entire community.


