

## How Does it Work?

Los Angeles County Department of Public Social Services identifies families/individuals who are in need during the holiday season. Services provided by DPSS include: CalWORKs (low-income families), CalFresh, Medi-Cal, and In-Home Supportive Services consumers (low-income elderly, blind or disabled individuals, including children).

- The families/individuals provide their consent for release of limited personal information to the sponsor. This information includes their name, telephone number, address, family size, and most importantly, a "wish list."
- The "wish list' is provided to you and you assemble the new selected gifts that are within your budget. No gift is too small and there is no minimum required.
- As a sponsor, you contact the family to get more detailed information on what is needed or wanted and make arrangements for delivery or pick up of items (NOTE: For privacy reasons, it is recommended to block your phone number by dialing \*67 when contacting the families).



- Recent homelessness/unstable living situation
- Illness or recent death in the family
- Recent job loss
- Family has a special needs child
- Elderly/disabled individuals
