

Metrolink Discount for Low-Income Riders

Metrolink last month introduced Mobility-4-All, the relaunch of its lowincome discount program. It offers a 50% discount on all Metrolink tickets and passes for riders with a California Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card. Riders can use their EBT card at any

Riders can use their EBT card at any Metrolink station ticket machine to validate and unlock the discount.

Carpools to Ride Free in 405 Express Lanes

When express toll lanes open later this year on the I-405 in Orange County, vehicles with three or more people will be able to ride free, according to Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). Vehicles with two people will be able to travel on the lanes for free during non-peak hours.
