Want to Save Time by Using Express Lanes? 5 Things You Need to Know...

With the recent opening of express lanes on the 405 Freeway, more people than ever are wondering how they can take advantage of these time-saving lanes. Here are five things you need to know to use them:

1. Unlike carpool lanes—which are free to motorists who meet occupancy minimums (typically 2+ or 3+ passengers)—express lanes allow drivers to enjoy traffic-free lanes for a toll. This includes solo drivers.
2. Express lanes are always separated from general use lanes and marked by signage.
3. Carpools can ride free or at a discount on all Southern California express lanes, with varying restrictions.
 - **1-10 Metro ExpressLanes:** 3+ carpools travel toll-free at all hours. Vehicles with two occupants pay a toll during peak hours (5-9 a.m., 4-7 p.m.) but ride toll-free the rest of the time.
 - **1-110 Metro ExpressLanes:** 2+ carpools travel toll-free.
 - **405 Express Lanes:** 3+ carpools travel toll-free.
 - **91 Express Lanes:** 3+ carpools travel toll-free in a designated lane, except



eastbound, Monday through Friday, from 4 to 6 p.m. (when they get 50% off the posted toll).

- **15 Express Lanes:** 3+ carpools get a discount of 50% off the posted toll.
- 4. All vehicles using express lanes must have a **FasTrak transponder** with a valid account from which tolls can be deducted. Even carpools traveling free must have a transponder set to the number of people in the vehicle.
- 5. If you ride in any of Southern California's express lanes without a transponder, you'll receive a fine in the mail (based on the address registered to your license plate). Fines are typically \$25 and above per violation, except on the 110 and 10 freeways, where fines have been reduced to \$4 plus the posted toll.
