Summer means the return of free trolleys that can shuttle you to beaches, local attractions, restaurants, shopping and more.

In Orange County, you can hop on trolleys in the **Balboa Peninsula, Dana Point, Laguna Niguel** and **San Clemente**.

Free trolleys will also serve routes in **Laguna Beach** and **San Juan Capistrano**.

Mountain Transit in San Bernardino operates free summer shuttles serving **Big Bear, Crestline** and **Lake Arrowhead**.

3 Big Metrolink Bargains

1. Metrolink has brought back its **Summer Day Pass**. It’s only \$15 to ride all day, Monday through Friday, anywhere Metrolink goes.
2. \$10 Weekend Day Pass allows for a day of unlimited travel on Saturdays and Sundays. (**Kids Ride Free** on weekends—up to three children with a paying adult.)
3. The Holiday Pass rate will allow you to travel for only **\$10 on the Fourth of July**.

New Fares and Discounts on Metro Micro

Metro Micro on-demand shuttles offer door-to-door service in eight zones throughout Los Angeles County. Fares are now \$2.50 per ride, and riders can transfer to Metro buses and trains for free.

Metro riders transferring from a bus or train to a Metro Micro shuttle only pay 75 cents.
