NATURE OF CASE

On September 21, 2010, Plaintiff was a passenger on a DASH bus that nearly collided broad-sided into a Sheriff's Department jail bus that was completing its left turn into the Clara Shortridge Foltz Criminal Justice Center jail bus entrance on North Spring Street near the intersection with Temple Street. The DASH bus allegedly applied his brakes and caused Plaintiff to hit her left side of her body against a pole support, resulting in soft tissue injuries to her neck, back, and right knee. Veolia Transportation Services, Inc., the operator of the DASH bus lines, responded and investigated the accident, but did not report the incident to law enforcement nor did it seek to identify the jail bus driver while at the incident scene. Plaintiff contends that the jail bus driver, the DASH bus driver, or both, were negligent in the operation of their buses.

Due to the risks and uncertainties of litigation, a full and final settlement of this case is recommended in the amount of \$25,000. Veolia Transportation Services, Inc. has agreed to match the County's settlement contribution.
