This case involves a collision that occurred on

January 4, 2014, when the Ford Crown Victoria radio car driven by a Deputy Sheriff collided with the

Toyota Corolla vehicle driven by plaintiff Teresita Garcia at the intersection of

Rosecrans Avenue and Norwalk Boulevard in the City of Norwalk. Ms. Garcia claims to have suffered injuries and damages from the accident. Due to the risks and uncertainties of litigation, a full and final

settlement of the case is warranted.

Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	Teresita Garcia v. County of Los Angeles, et al. Summary Corrective Action Plan 2017-052
	On Saturday, January 4, 2014, at approximately 11:50 p.m., two on-duty Los Angeles County deputy sheriffs, assigned to Norwalk Station, were traveling in a marked Crown Victoria patrol vehicle west on Rosecrans Avenue, in response to a "burglary now" call for service.
	As the patrol vehicle approached the intersection at Norwalk Boulevard the first deputy sheriff (driver) saw the traffic signal at the intersection change from green to red, for her direction of travel. The first deputy sheriff slowed to approximately 34 MPH, turned on the patrol vehicle's overhead rotating lights, and proceeded into the intersection against the red light.
	Simultaneously, the plaintiff was driving a Toyota Corolla northbound or Norwalk Boulevard and entered the intersection with Rosecrans Avenue on a green light, at approximately 25 MPH.
	The two vehicles collided in the intersection when the front bumper of the plaintiff's vehicle struck the left front fender of the patrol vehicle.
	The plaintiff and both deputy sheriffs complained of pain and were transported to local hospitals for treatment of their injuries.
	Both drivers claim they did not see the other vehicle prior to the collision Both vehicles sustained major damage due to the collision.

Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

The **Department** root cause in this incident is the first deputy sheriff failed to stop for a red traffic light.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

Traffic Collision Investigation

This incident was thoroughly investigated by representatives from the Norwalk Station, Traffic Unit.

The collision investigation concluded that the first deputy sheriff caused the collision as she entered the intersection against a red light, in violation of California Vehicle Code section 21453(a).

The results of the traffic investigation were presented to Department executives to determine if the deputy sheriff's actions constituted misconduct.

Administrative Investigation

This incident was investigated by representatives at Norwalk Station to determine if any administrative misconduct occurred before, during, or after this incident. The results of the investigation were presented for Department executive adjudication.

Executive evaluation of this incident found the deputy sheriffs' actions were in violation of Department policy. Appropriate administrative action has been taken.

Audit and Assessment of Employee Traffic Collisions at Norwalk Station

Norwalk Station conducted a review and assessment of all employee related traffic collisions from July 2013, through the end of the 2016 calendar year. Based on this audit, a traffic reduction – risk management plan was developed.

The Norwalk Station Traffic Collision Reduction - Risk Management Plan will serve as Norwalk Station's outline for ongoing traffic collision reduction efforts. The intent of the plan is to reduce exposure to auto liability by reducing preventable traffic accidents and minimize the loss or decline of Department resources.

During the audit, it was discovered that the total number of traffic collisions between July 2013, and the 2016 calendar year decreased by approximately 10%.

The most frequently cited causes of traffic collisions at Norwalk Station were unsafe starting or backing (16.7%), improper turning (13.6%), and unsafe speed (13.6%).

Within this plan, specific risk management issues have been identified and goals have been established. Strict audits concerning the condition of the fleet and coordination between Department patrol stations and Traffic Services Detail will ensure timely and appropriate mitigation efforts.

Additionally, Norwalk Station will expand driver's training to all employees involved in a traffic collision, and ensure they attend the Sheriff's Department's Alternatives to Discipline Driving Course or the Sheriff Traffic Accident Reduction (S.T.A.R.) driving program.
