Virtual Events

Angela Law and Winnie Fong didn't want the census momentum to slow down due to COVID-19. They held a virtual meeting with their nonprofit's Steering Committee to present information about the census, particularly its importance for Asian-American communities.

After the presentation, over 35 participants pledged to complete their census after hearing how an undercount would have devastating effects.

Why is the Census Important for AAPI?

- Asian-Americans are the fastest growing population in the nation. Based on the 2020 Census Barriers, Attitudes, and Motivators Study (CBAMS) Survey, when asked "How likely would you be to fill out the census form?," only 55% of Asian Americans said they were "extremely" or "very" likely to fill out the Census form, compared to 69% of Whites, and 65% of Latinos, and 64% of Blacks.
- Challenges:
 - Linguistic barrier
 - Unfamiliarity with census
 - Distrust in government

"Because of challenges, such as language barriers and unfamiliarity with the census, Asian and Pacific Islanders (API) have historically been undercounted. We need to educate our community about the importance of the census and address those challenges in order to reach the hard-to-count areas in Los Angeles."



Sample text messages

- You're important to me and I want to make sure you're counted in the 2020 Census. You can respond online at My2020Census.gov, by phone or mail.
- Did you apply for unemployment insurance? Did you know census data helps determine funding for it? Go to My2020Census.gov to do your census.
- I hope you're staying safe and well at home. Have you filled out your census? It's so quick and easy. You can even do it over your phone. Go to My2020Census.gov
- Hi-I'm checking in with all my friends to make sure they've completed their census. Have you?
- We can't control the future, but we can plan ahead. Reminding you to fill out your census at My2020Census.gov if you haven't already.

Many things are vying for our attention right now. But, did you know that some, if not all of the issues in the COVID-19 headlines right now are related to the census? Medicare, unemployment insurance, free school lunches and more is determined by census data. In 2020, we're relying on 2010's data. Whatever the 'new normal' ends up looking like, you can't deny that an undercount this year would make the next 10 years unconscionably more difficult.

This is why it's important to sing the praises and importance of the census in any way you can. You can physically distance while building closeness with your community, at the same time.

Self-Response Activation Events




If you would like to discuss partnering on a self-response activation event in the future (while adhering to public health guidelines), let us know!

Phone Banking


Phone Banking Calls Made



On March 31st, we kicked off our phone banking initiative with the help of the City Clerk's Office and census volunteers.

To date, we've recruited over 60 volunteers, and made almost 40,000 calls to hard-to-count communities across Los Angeles.

SMS Text Messaging




Over 9,000 text messages have been sent, and over 2,000 responses have been received. Messages are used to announce important Census events and recruit for volunteer activities including Phone Banking.






