# 2000-01 Budget Includes State & Federally-Funded Changes:

- DPSS (excluding the assistance budget), \$76.0
   Million and 562 positions
- Mental Health, \$39.3 Million and 65 positions
- Children and Family Services (again excluding assistance costs), additional funding of \$15.4 Million
- District Attorney-Family Support, \$3.1 Million and 63.0 positions for child support enhancements

# Other Major Changes:

- \$10.1 Million in Health Services for expanded enrollment in the Healthy Families Program
- Funding to maintain MacLaren's Children's Center at approximately 125 children
- \$3.0 Million for the Fire Department's Emergency Medical Services Program and to comply with Federal and State 2 In – 2 Out requirements
- \$4.6 Million for Sheriff's Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) in the unincorporated areas
- \$0.3 Million for the Agricultural Commissioner/ Weights and Measures' Red Imported Fire Ant Eradication Program



# The Proposed Budget Provides The Following Public Services:

## **Health Services:**

- 3,077,000 outpatient visits
- 401,000 hospital emergency room visits
- 510,000 public health visits
- 673,000 hospital inpatient days

## **Enhanced Mental Health Services:**

- 14,000 additional outpatient clinic visits
- Case management services for 3,700 additional clients
- Crisis stabilization services for 2,700 additional clients
- Day treatment services for 300 additional clients

## **Social Services:**

- Medi-Cal eligibility services for 1.5 million persons per month, including an additional 120,000 children
- Child care for 34,000 children per month in the CalWORKs Program whose parents are involved in employment or educational programs

- In-Home Supportive Services for 107,600 aged, blind or disabled persons (avg. monthly caseload)
- Over 2,500,000 meals provided to older Americans
- Training programs for 30,000 participants, including dislocated workers
- District Attorney Family Support services to 559,000 families

## **Public Protection:**

- Fire and emergency services provided by 2,669 firefighters to over 3.6 million residents
- Probation-detention for an average daily census of 4,100 juveniles in camps and halls
- Coroner investigations of 24,710 deaths

- Incarceration for an average daily inmate population of 21,000 (based upon 1999 calendar year)
- Patrol services provided by 3,800 law enforcement personnel
- Ocean lifeguard rescue services to protect an estimated 52 million beach visitors

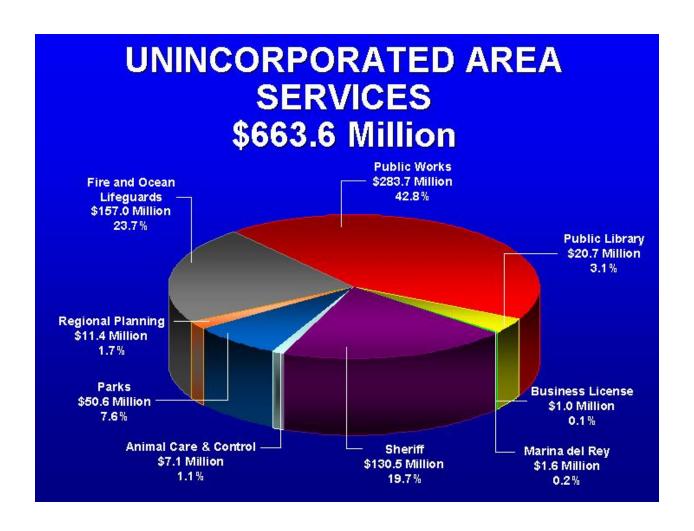
## **General Services:**

- Issuance of 68,000 marriage licenses
- Performance of 7,600 marriage ceremonies
- Consumer affairs counseling for 324,044 clients

- Issuance of 55,000 building permits
- Adoption or return of over 30,000 dogs and cats
- Recordation and filing of 173,000 birth certificates

## **Recreation and Cultural:**

- Parks and recreation services for 18.3 million visitors and 1.8 million rounds of golf
- Museum of Art and Museum of Natural History exhibits for 1.6 million visitors
- Library services to 11.0 million visitors
