REPORT BACK ON MOVING FORWARD ON THE EQUITABLE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN AND THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT EXPEDITED CONTRACTING (ITEM NO. 25, AGENDA OF SEPTEMBER 15, 2021, AND ITEM NO. 12, AGENDA OF NOVEMBER 30, 2021)

On September 15, 2021, the Board of Supervisors (Board) adopted a motion directing the Chief Executive Officer, in collaboration with County Counsel, to provide bi-monthly reports on the implementation of the equity formula and principles in the American Rescue Plan (ARP) contracting process and to include updates on the public dashboard and website that ensure implementation information is available to the public. A follow-up motion adopted by the Board on November 30, 2021, directed the Chief Executive Office (CEO) to submit quarterly reports on the status of contracts executed for programs approved in the ARP Spending Plan, as well as any subsequent new or amended ARP Spending Plans.

This report provides an update on the above-noted directives since the previously submitted Board memo dated December 26, 2023, including:

- The status of Request for Statements of Qualification (RFSQs) for contracted services using ARP funding;
- ARP project status, budget, and contracting updates, including updates on launch dates, encumbrances and expenditures for approved programs, and contracting activities. A list of external partner agreements, inclusive of service contracts and purchase orders, is in the Attachment; and
- An update on department evaluation plan activities to measure the fidelity of program implementation and the impact of investments in achieving an equitable recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.



RFSQ Update

The RFSQ for the ARP Support Services Master Agreement (MA) released on April 29, 2022, remains open to ensure vendors can qualify as a contractor under the MA. Currently, there are 40 vendors qualified to provide services in six categories. ARP Project Status and ARP Contracting Updates

As of February 2, 2024, all eight newly funded projects in the ARP Phase Two Spending Plan are approved for project launch. The CEO continues to track project launch dates and budget encumbrances and expenditures for all funded projects. As of February 2, 2024, nearly all projects have been approved for launch and their funding amounts encumbered and/or expended vary depending on their level of implementation. As of January 11, 2024, more than 57 percent of funds for all projects were encumbered with more than 25 percent of the funds expended.

As of February 2, 2024, 12 departments reported having or are in the process of awarding a total of 255 agreements with 193 external agencies, inclusive of service contracts and purchase orders. Awarded agreements total \$785,592,011.23. A list of ARP-funded agreements is provided in the Attachment.

ARP Evaluation Plan Update

The Anti-Racism Diversity and Inclusion (ARDI) Initiative, continues to work with a contractor to design and execute a Countywide ARP evaluation plan. Evaluation templates to collect data from ARP-funded programs in compliance with the U.S. Treasury Guidance and requirements set forth by the ARP and Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds program will be implemented by April 2024. Concurrently, ARDI is tracking the implementation of program-level evaluations and will launch a technical assistance program for ARP-funded projects to examine the fidelity of their program implementations, progress on benchmarks and goals, and activities to complete their project evaluation.

The Lead Evaluator also coordinates a team of advisors who assist ARP Project Leads and County staff on Evaluation Plan activities, collection and reporting of data and metrics, and submitting reports regarding completion of each evaluation milestone. These project-based evaluations will examine to what degree an intervention or program was delivered as intended, including whether the program:

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- Reached the intended outreach population;
- Maintained fidelity with the proposed program design;
- Achieved the goals and objectives; and
- Accomplished the desired impact of improving the lives of participants by helping them recover from the negative economic and health impacts of the pandemic.

Finally, ARDI will release a baseline survey to assess the departments' data capacity needs, as well as a monthly progress report template to track implementation progress of program designs, collection of data, services provided, target demographics, and program impact.

Reporting on the following two motions, Moving Forward on the Equitable Implementation of the American Rescue Plan and The American Rescue Plan Act Expedited Contracting will continue to take place on a quarterly basis. The next Board report is scheduled for May 15, 2024.
