During the procedure, the contrast leaked out of the blood circulation and caused injury (compartment syndrome) to his right hand.

  - Incomplete documentation of contrast extravasation while completing the CT exam.
  - Lack of standardized system for Fast Track NP on swing shift to sign out to on-duty Resident or Attending.
  - Failure to document findings from final re-exam prior to Mr. Hinojosa's discharge from the ED.
  - Lack of escalation by ED Attending and Resident when there were delays in reaching plastic surgery.
  - Failure to recognize developing compartment syndrome by ED Attendings and Residents.
  - Failure of the on-call Intern to respond to initial page to the Plastic Surgery Service.

  - Providers actions were examined using the Just Culture algorithm. Appropriate corrective actions were taken based on the Just Culture assessment.

  - All ED Attendings were reminded about the importance of escalating concerns through early contact with specialty service attending when there are delays in reaching on-call residents.

	The following is a synopsis obtained from the Trial Counsel Report, Narrative Supplemental Report and SH-R-257 (Supervisor's Report of incident or Damage to County Vehicle or Permittee's Vehicle).
	On October 7, 2020, at approximately 4:45 a.m., a Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff, assigned to Narcotics Bureau was driving his assigned, unmarked undercover vehicle northbound on Highway 71, approaching the 57 Freeway, when he was involved in a traffic collision.
	While driving at approximately 65 miles per hour, about to transition onto the northbound 57 Freeway, traffic suddenly stopped. The Deputy Sheriff applied his brakes and slowed his vehicle to approximately 35 miles per hour, but he was unable to stop his vehicle. He subsequently rear-ended the plaintiff's vehicle. The force from the collision caused the plaintiff's vehicle to collide with the rear end of another vehicle, which was also stopped in northbound traffic on Highway 71.
	A California Highway Patrol Officer responded to the collision and conducted a traffic collision investigation.
	The Deputy Sheriff notified an LASD Sheriff's supervisor and advised he was involved in a traffic collision. The supervisor responded to the collision location and authored Supervisor's Report of Incident or Damage to County Vehicle investigation.
	The Deputy Sheriff was able to drive his vehicle off the freeway with the assistance of California Highway Patrol.
	Following the traffic collision, the Plaintiff complained of pain to his back, right rib cage area, chest, shoulders, and left arm.
	The Plaintiff's vehicle was towed off the freeway.
	The Los Angeles County Fire Department responded to the location and rendered aid.
tani tani tani ta	The Deputy Sheriff sustained injuries related to the traffic collision.

The Plaintiff was transported to the hospital for additional medical treatment.
The Third Driver did not sustain any injuries in the traffic collision. The CHP Officer determined the Deputy Sheriff was the primary cause of the traffic collision, in violation of California Vehicle Code Section 22350.

1. Briefly describe the root cause(s) of the claim/lawsuit:

A **Department** root cause in this incident was the deputy sheriff was driving at an unsafe speed in violation of 22350, California Vehicle Code.

A **Department** root cause of this incident is the deputy sheriff failed to stop his vehicle before colliding into the back of the Plaintiff's vehicle, which caused the Plaintiff's vehicle to collide into another vehicle.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions: (Include each corrective action, due date, responsible party, and any disciplinary actions if appropriate)

#### Traffic Collision Investigation

This incident was investigated by an officer from the California Highway Patrol.

The collision investigation concluded the Deputy Sheriff caused the collision by driving at an unsafe speed, in violation of California Vehicle Code section - 22350 (Exhibit A).

#### Administrative Investigation

This incident was investigated by representatives at Narcotics Bureau to determine if any administrative misconduct occurred before, during, or after this incident. The results of the investigation were presented for Department executive adjudication.

Executive evaluation of this incident determined no violations of Department policy.

On October 14, 2020, the Deputy Sheriff attended driver's training. Since this incident, he has not been involved in any additional traffic collisions.

The Deputy Sheriff involved in this incident attended training pertaining to the circumstances surrounding this incident.

#### Traffic Collision Assessment and Review

As a result of this collision, an assessment of employee-involved traffic collisions was conducted from January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2022. The audit revealed the following:

The number of preventable traffic collisions over the past five years was not excessive based on the amount of driving conducted by personnel assigned to Narcotics Bureau.

However, in an attempt to improve employee safety and reduce the Department's liability exposure, Narcotics Bureau continues to schedule personnel to the four and eight-hour driver training course facilitated by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Emergency Vehicle Operations Center.

This lawsuit arises from injuries allegedly sustained in an automobile accident involving a Fire Department vehicle which overturned while transporting inmate fire crew members.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors settlement of Item 4.f. in the amount of \$125,000.
