Date of incident/event:	April 14, 2023
Briefly provide a description of the incident/event:	On April 14, 2023, A 58 year old male patient underwent a complicated hernia repair procedure at Martin Luther King, Junior - Outpatient Center. After being discharged, the patient experienced abdominal pain. The following day, the patient went to an outside facility where it was discovered that he had suffered a bowel perforation as a result of the hernia repair procedure. The patient had to undergo two surgical procedures to repair the perforation.

1. Briefly describe the **<u>root cause(s)</u>** of the claim/lawsuit:

- The surgeon relied on imaging reports from a non-DHS hospital. Actual images of these studies were not available to the surgeon for review. The surgeon could have taken steps to obtain the images or should have obtained additional imaging before scheduling the surgery.
- During the surgery, the surgeon became aware that the surgery was technically more complex than anticipated. The surgeon should have considered transferring the patient to a hospital for observation after completion of the surgery.
- The surgeon did not document pertinent past medical history and past surgical history in the H&P note on 6/1/22. Specifically, the surgeon did not document the date of the preceding appendectomy performed at the MLK Community Hospital.

Additional findings addressed in the CAP:

The ASC nursing protocol requires nurses to call the patient for a follow-up check within 72 hours or the next business day after a weekend or holiday following surgery or a procedure. When the patient does not answer the call, the protocol required nurses to send a written follow up reminder via mail.

2. Briefly describe recommended corrective actions:

- Using the Just Culture evaluation process, all appropriate personnel actions were taken including formal counseling. Additional remediation includes monitoring the surgeon including random audits of the providers notes to ensure that the surgeon reviews outside images and medical records when indicated.
- The ASC Nursing Protocol for post operative follow-up was updated. If the nurse is unable to reach the patient on their phone, an additional attempt is to be made to the patient's emergency contact.

a. <u>Michael D. Simpson v. County of Los Angeles, et al.</u> United States District Court Case No. 2:21-cv-04403

This federal civil rights lawsuit arises out of the fatal deputy-involved shooting of Plaintiff's son.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board recommended to the Board of Supervisors settlement of Item 4(a) in the amount of \$800,000.

b. <u>Hannah Allison, et al. v. County of Los Angeles, et al.</u> United States District Court Case No. 2:21-cv-06171

This federal civil rights lawsuit concerns allegations of false arrest and arises from Plaintiffs' participation in an unlawful assembly that took place on June 3, 2020, on County property.

Action Taken:

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(b) in the amount of \$100,000.

The Claims Board approved settlement of Item 4(c) in the amount of \$85,000.
