LA County Wildfire Recovery

July 7, 2025

Since the devastating fires earlier this year, Los Angeles County has mobilized quickly to aid in the recovery efforts and deliver meaningful early results for the communities impacted by the fires. Here are some of the highlights:

- Supported the fastest post-disaster debris removal operation in California history, completing work nearly six months ahead of prior largescale recovery efforts, thanks to unprecedented coordination across city, County, State, and federal partners, including FEMA and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
- Cleared more than 10,000 total parcels of fire debris in both Eaton and Palisades fire zones.
- Moved +200,000 truckloads contained more than 2.5 million tons of fire debris.
- Deployed more than \$50 million in direct financial relief to homeowners, renters, small businesses, nonprofits, and workers through the LA County Household Relief Grant and the LA Region Small Business and Worker Relief Fund.
- **\$3.1 billion in federal funds** approved for impacted residents and businesses.
- 11,000 low-interest disaster loans from the Small Business Association.
- Cut permitting costs by deferring and refunding permit fees for eligible property owners rebuilding single family homes. Residents can check their eligibility on the Fee Waivers & Refunds page.
- **Established multi-use recovery centers** to connect residents with in-person support, services and resources in their communities.
- Sped up the review process by creating resources for builders, including a library of pre-approved home designs and self-inspection for licensed architects and engineers:
