PROGRAM NOTES

- *Open from July 20 - September 8 (about seven weeks)*
- *Hours during the Games: 10am - 10pm*
- *Hours between Games: 10am - 10pm or 10am - 6pm*
- *Planned by the City of Paris and delivered by contractors*
- *Staffed with volunteers and municipal employees*
- *Olympic and Paralympic broadcast*
- *Programming by neighborhood cultural & sports associations*
- *Largely funded by the City of Paris*
- *La Terrasse at Hôtel de Ville: 837,000 total visitors*
- *16 neighborhood sites: 1.6 million total visitors*
- *Challenges: crowd mgmt., logistics, programming, & flexibility*

Metro's Transit-First Fan Zone Approach

Defining Fan Zones

- > Public gatherings to view major sporting events that bring communities together, often coupled with entertainment, food, and cultural or recreational programming
- > Metro is considering all types of Fan Zones
 - Can be referred to as Fan Fests, Activations, Watch Parties, Live Sites, etc.
 - Do not have to be officially designated by FIFA/Los Angeles Sports Entertainment Commission (LASEC) and LA28 for the Olympic and Paralympic Games or community-led events.
- > LASEC:
 - Released Official Fan Zone request for proposals (RFP) on 8/21, applications closed on 9/26; will select sites by Nov. 1
 - Released Community Activation Toolkit for non-official Fan Zones
- > LA28:
 - Plans to begin releasing toolkit resources and request for interest (RFI) by end of 2025

Preliminary Transit-First Fan Zone Criteria

Criteria 1: Transit and Multi-Modal Accessibility - 6 pts

- Proximity to high-capacity transit – 3 pts
- First/Last Mile (FLM) & ADA Accessibility – 3 pts
- Bonus point awarded if the Fan Zone is in an Equity Focus Community (EFC)

Criteria 2: Geographic Dispersion and Equity – Qualitative Review

- Dispersion of site relative to Games venues and other Fan Zones
- Equity evaluation using Metro Equity Needs Index and map of EFCs

Criteria 3: Event Readiness – Qualitative Review

- Heat resilience of site
- History of activation at the site

Criteria 4: Reflects Local Culture – Qualitative Review

- Location is culturally significant or iconic

Criteria 5: Cross Agency Coordination – Qualitative Review

- Site is being planned as a coordinated effort between multiple agencies

Transit-First Fan Zones - Benefits

> Identifying and co-promoting Transit-First Fan Zones hosted by others. Metro will:

- Apply Transit-First Fan Zone criteria to support hosts' identification of Fan Zone locations.
- Co-promote Transit-First Fan Zones using several marketing communications channels.

> Process:


- Metro is currently developing a webpage with more information and for hosts to submit Transit-First Fan Zone qualifications.
- Hosts interested in being designated as Transit-First will be asked to demonstrate proximity to transit, first/last mile connections, and at least one accessible path of travel between transit stops and the Fan Zone locations.

Transit-First Fan Zones Approach – County Coordination

- > **Participating in up to one Fan Zone per Supervisorial District in Los Angeles County. For World Cup Metro will:**
 - Invest in matching funds for one Transit-First County-led Fan Zone in each Supervisorial District (SD) for the World Cup (for SD1, that is Union Station/Olvera Street)
 - Promote Fan Zones through a variety of measures, such as social media, the press, Metro's trip planning app, and a forthcoming cultural map.
 - Not lead applications, programming, or other funding efforts for these Fan Zones.



Other Coordination Efforts

- > Open and Slow Streets Grant Program – *almost 50 applications received!*
- > Kit of Parts for Temporary Bike and Pedestrian Pathways and Mobility Hubs
- > Supporting Jurisdictions in Identifying Eligible Local Funds
- > Mobility Hubs and Station Area Activations

- Build civic pride and international relationships beyond 2028.




NEW ZEALAND HOUSE – OPEN, FREE & COMMUNITY-FOCUSED

- Free and open to all—a public alternative to private or ticketed venues.
- Daily performances, live event screenings, and cultural exchange.
- Integration with local artists, students, and downtown businesses.





BALANCING VISION AND FISCAL REALITY

- Initial Council feedback: ensure public costs align with community benefits.
- Re-scoped vision:
 - City cost cap – \$800 K (max)
 - NZOC provides \approx \$450 K in staging & technical infrastructure
 - City retains co-curation and sponsorship role
- Focus shifted from hosting to co-creating.




AN OPEN MODEL FOR EQUITABLE ENGAGEMENT

- Open access supports inclusion and visibility for all residents.
- Integrates local performers, youth, and schools.
- Creates economic uplift through downtown vibrancy.
- Demonstrates how arts and diplomacy intersect in small-city contexts.

A WORK IN PROGRESS – TOWARD 2028 AND BEYOND

- Formalize agreement and launch pre-Games activations (2026-27).
- Pilot school + arts exchanges with New Zealand partners.
- Continue refining funding and legacy components.
