EXPAND OPERATIONAL/PROGRAMMATIC SERVICES - LA County communities, through the continual strategic planning processes, expressed increased demands for educational and literacy-based services (such as after school tutoring and sustainability of tutoring platforms to mitigate the educational gap), minimizing the digital divide, and enhancing workforce development opportunities.	External	Libraries play a vital role to provide education and information for underserved communities. However, expanding services to meet their growing needs presents challenges due to budget constraints. The following are key benefits of expanded library services: - Educational support such as after-school tutoring or tutoring platforms - Digital access to ebooks, computers, and other materials - Workforce development assistance to youths and seniors - Social service resources that includes health-related needs To maintain the necessary service levels for the communities we serve, securing ongoing and sustainable funding is essential.
SAFE SPACE - Libraries should be safe spaces to provide inclusive access, support vulnerable populations, promote learning, encourage community engagement, and allow free expression.	Internal	Maintaining libraries as safe spaces requires: - Increased staffing that meets the needs for social service model balanced with security measures to ensure staff and patron safety - Health and safety facility upgrades (cameras, access) - Community programs to meet the demands of the PEH population and those with mental health needs

REVENUE DECREASE the Library is primarily funded by property taxes and with the recent wildfires, there may be impact to its property tax collection	External	Recent wildfires have likely caused property damage or destruction, potentially reducing the tax base and impacting future tax revenue collection. - Reduced property valuations - Delayed tax payments or increased delinquencies - Operational impact may result in service reductions; budget constraints; staffing adjustments.
